







































Poker Hands

In Texas Hold'em poker players construct hands of five cards. These hands are compared using a hand ranking system, the player with the highest-ranking hand wins. The ranking of a particular hand is increased by including multiple cards of the same card rank, by all five cards being from the same suit, or by all five cards being of consecutive rank.
